

## **TREVOR WILLIAMSON**

### **Background**

Trevor gained a BSc in Management Sciences in 1976 and an MBA in Financial Management in 1994. He spent much of his working life, before joining the University in 1992, in the banking sector. He worked for Chartered Trust plc and Girobank plc, where he was National Corporate Accounts Manager, and Head of Commercial Lending. In these roles he was a member of the Bank's Credit Policy Committee and Quality Council. He was granted Fellowship of the Chartered Institute of Bankers in 2005 and appointed a Senior Faculty Member of the ifs School of Finance in 2009 in recognition of his contribution to banking and banking education.

Trevor joined the University to oversee development of a Financial Services degree programme and more recently has been involved in development of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes related to the Financial Planning profession. He gained the Certified Financial Planner qualification in 2008 and is a member of the Education Board for the Institute of Financial Planning.

Trevor is a Fellow of the Higher Education Authority and was appointed a Senior Learning and Teaching Fellow at the Business School in 2001, in which capacity he had a leading role in the introduction of personal development planning schemes for undergraduate students.

His main teaching interests are credit and risk management, and financial management. His main research interests are in financial planning and accounting education, especially the use of the case method for teaching and learning.

He is a tutor for ecch (formerly the European Case Clearing House) and has run case teaching and writing workshops at leading business schools in the UK, Europe, India, Indonesia and Africa.
